Leonardo A. Villalón is Dean of the International Center and Professor of Political Science and African Studies at the University of Florida. From 2002-2011 he served as director of UF's Title VI Center for African Studies. His research focuses on religion and democracy in Senegal, Mali and Niger, as well as on social change and political dynamics in Francophone West Africa. He has published numerous works on religion and politics and on democratization in the Muslim countries of the Sahel. He has published widely on these topics, and his research has been funded by various sources. He was named a Carnegie Scholar by the Carnegie Corporation (2007-09), for a project on: "Negotiating Democracy in Muslim Contexts: Political Liberalization and Religious Mobilization in the West African Sahel." He also directed a two year collaborative research project on religion and educational reform in the Sahel for the Africa Power and Politics (APPP) research consortium funded by the UK government. He is also co-editor of the *Journal of Modern African Studies*.
