

Dr Katarzyna Falęcka is Lecturer in Art History at the School of Arts and Cultures, Newcastle University, with expertise in modern and contemporary art from North Africa. She is a Humanities Fellow and coordinates the CAORC/Andrew W. Mellon Fellowship in Modern Art History at CEMAT. She has an international publication record and has published articles in African Arts and Third Text, as well as multiple book chapters, including the forthcoming contribution to A Companion to French Art, eds.
